## Lockheed Martin **Makes a Big Difference**

Headquartered in Bethesda, Maryland, Lockheed Martin is a global security and aerospace company that employs about 112,000 people worldwide. The company is principally engaged in the research, design, development, manufacturing, integration, and sustainment of advanced technology systems, products, and services.

In May 2015, one of the local branches of Lockheed Martin based in Colorado Springs chose Care and Share Food Bank for the focus of their Project M.E.N.U. (Mission. Engage. Nourish. Unite) efforts.

The employees of Lockheed Martin hosted a virtual food drive, traditional food drive, volunteered, and conducted many internal fundraising events, such as a sundae bar kick-off event, afternoon nacho bar, and a Lockheed Martin Night at Texas Roadhouse to raise funds, food, and friends for Care and Share Food Bank.

**They raised a total of \$2,004.50 in cash contributions, equating to 16,704 meals.**

Lockheed Martin's employees donate \$20 million annually to various organizations through workplace-giving campaigns and volunteer an average of 1 million hours each year.

As a responsible corporate citizen, Lockheed Martin also plays an active role in helping to strengthen the quality of life in our country and the communities where their employees live and work.

## A Futures Market **for Nutritious Produce**

In the fall of 2014 we featured one of our farming partners, Mauro Farms of Pueblo, in our Investment Report. This relationship continues to evolve and will progress into the future.

Last year, we received more than 340,000 pounds of produce through Mauro Farms. In working together to find ways to increase the food we receive and decrease costs, we explored the idea of planned growing with the farm.

We currently have a planned growing program with Metz Potato Farm in Monte

Vista. We agree on a weekly need, and they plant in anticipation of that need.

We have contracted with Mauro Farms to grow two crops for us this season: sweet corn and watermelon. We will be receiving a load of each crop every week during the harvest season, in addition to other items that come up as usual. We expect this to not only lower costs, but to guarantee a steady stream of nutritious produce from this farm all season long. If this works well, we plan to expand our program with Mauro Farms and other farms in our service area!


