PARTNER AGENCY HIGHLIGHT



ANTIOCH COMMUNITY CHURCH

Antioch Community Church was founded in 1910 in support of the farming and ranching communities in southeast El Paso County. The staff and volunteers have been providing uninterrupted service for more than 100 years. They continue to serve the Truckton area by providing religious services, fellowship and community activity.

The church's community outreach includes partnerships with Care and Share Food Bank, Peak Vista's Community Health Homeless Rural Medical Van, Springs Rescue Mission, and Catholic Charities. The church's fellowship makes resource information available concerning SNAP benefits, LEAP, tax information, and free GED instruction and testing when requested.

The pantry was formed in 2009 and initially served 28 families out of a closet in the church facility. Today, the pantry serves approximately 192 families.

The pantry is run by one part-time unpaid church member and approximately 20 volunteers. Funds to operate the pantry come from both church and non-church sources which truly makes this a community project.

Dear Friends,

182,000 school-aged children in Southern Colorado are at risk of losing access to nutritious, affordable meals during the summer. At a time when most children are enjoying swimming pools, vacations, and time with their friends and family, more than 1 in 5 Southern Colorado children are at risk of hunger, which equates to more than 58,000 children who need our help. Where will Roman and Ashley eat?

Research has shown that even mild under-nutrition experienced by young children during critical periods of growth may lead to reductions in physical growth and adversely affect brain development. Proper nutrition is vital to the growth and development of all children.

The Summer Food Service Program provides low-income children with free, nutritious meals during the summer months when school is not in session. Last summer, nearly **26,000** meals and nearly **34,000** snacks were served through Care and Share's Summer Food Service Program. Help us fight hunger this summer – become a Hunger Action Hero!

Summer Food Service Program

Each summer, children wait for the last bell of the school year. Summer is an exciting time for children to enjoy friends, a family vacation, or swimming at the pool. However, for many children who receive free and reduced-price meals at school, summer can mean hunger. Just as learning doesn't end when school lets out, neither does a child's need for good nutrition.

This summer, meals will be served at 40 sites throughout Care and Share's 31-county service area.

Care and Share Food Bank provides free meals to children during the summer as part of the USDA Summer Food Service Program. This summer, meals will be served at 40 sites throughout Care and Share's 31-county service area. There are no income requirements or registration. Any child under age 18 may come to eat.

We encourage you to make a donation before your vacation to help us fight hunger this summer.

The cost to feed a child this summer typically costs \$97.50 for an average 30-day program. In Care and

Cooking Matters

Families on a tight budget report that the cost of healthy groceries is their biggest barrier to making nutritious meals at home. Building on its proven success of teaching families how to cook and eat healthy on a budget, **Share Our Strength's Cooking Matters®** has created a line of tools called **Cooking Matters at the Store** to help families make

healthy and affordable choices at the supermarket.

During **Cooking Matters at the Store** tours, participants practice key food shopping skills like buying fruits and vegetables on a budget, comparing unit prices, reading food labels, and identifying whole grain foods. Within the last two months, the **Cooking Matters at the Store** program has assisted 297 participants in Southern Colorado.



Clients from Care and Share partner agency, Loaves and Fishes, participated in the most recent tour at the local Safeway

in Canon City. **Cooking Matters** facilitators spoke to participants about utilizing their local food pantry and incorporating a portion of their food budgets to make the healthiest choices in preparing meals. Eating healthy does not cost a fortune and it can be very simple to make a change in purchasing and eating habits.

Cooking Matters at the Store participants take home a booklet with recipes and shopping tips, a reusable grocery bag, and receive a \$10 gift card to purchase healthy food items that they learned about in the tour. Visit ShoppingMatters.org for more information.
