A Gobble for All Turkey Drive at Panera Bread will be held from November 16th through November 22nd. All Colorado Springs Panera Bread locations will serve as drop-off points for frozen turkeys. Please take the frozen turkey into the café. We'd like to thank our friends at Two Men and a Truck for generously supporting this drive by providing the transportation from Panera's freezers to ours.

Captain Dan and Tammy Oakland of Sunny 106.3's morning team will rally their listeners again for Take a Turkey to Work Day on Friday, November 20th from 6 a.m. until 6 p.m. We invite you to organize an office collection, culminating on the 20th, and have one staff member bring the frozen turkeys to us at one of our participating Walmart locations: Chapel Hills/Razorback, 8th Street, Palmer Park/Powers, and Dillon

Your donation will appear on your next phone bill.

A one time donation of \$10.00 will be added to your mobile phone bill or deducted from your prepaid balance. Donor must be age 18+ and all donations must be authorized by the account holder (e.g. parents). By texting YES, the user agrees to the terms and conditions. All charges are billed by and payable to your mobile service provider. Service is available on most carriers. # Follow that Acorn...Squash!

A small vegetable's adventure fills a critical food need

During an early, beautiful morning in the fields at the nonprofit farm of Colorado Farm to Table in Salida, 24 totes of freshly harvested acorn squash wait to be picked up and loaded onto the Care and Share Food Bank truck. What's next? Delivery to Care and Share's main distribution warehouse in Colorado Springs.

By early afternoon, volunteer Gene looks over the beautiful acorn squash.

Later that day, acorn squash arrives at Fountain Valley Cares Emergency Food Pantry. Here a family receives acorn squash—packed with antioxidants and vitamins—along with other healthy, nutritious food they need.

Last stop: supper for tonight. Acorn squash has made its way onto plates at the dinner table of a family at risk of hunger.

To ensure that hungry people have consistent access to nutritious food, Care and Share sources, procures, processes and delivers food and grocery products from private donors, the food industry, local farmers and the state/federal government to emergency and non-emergency feeding programs throughout Southern Colorado.

This load of acorn squash was grown by Colorado Farm to Table, a nonprofit farm in Salida, which donates everything it grows, free of charge, to hunger relief organizations across Colorado.



We have one belief: no one should go hungry. Every gift of food, money, and time makes a difference all year long. Thank you for all that you do.
