THE BIG THREE

In 2021, we set our sights on achieving three bold initiatives, that we like to call, "The Big Three." We're proud to say that, thanks to your support, all three have become a reality.

SAN LUIS VALLEY DISTRIBUTION CENTER

Considered a historic moment in Care and Share history, we purchased our third Distribution Center, located in the San Luis Valley. Based in Alamosa, this expansion will improve our ability to serve our neighbors living in rural Southwest communities, and allow us to acquire more fresh produce from local growers, to transport across the 31 counties we serve.

CARE AND SHARE'S SUNNY SIDE MARKET

As part of our long-term strategy, we developed our own pantry network to bridge gaps where local resources cannot adequately relieve the need for food. In February 2021, our two Sunny Side Market locations opened their doors - in East Pueblo and Fountain.

MOBILE MARKET FLEET

We introduced our first Mobile Market in 2020. Since then, we've been able to secure a second Mobile Market that is dedicated to Pueblo. Our Mobile Market trucks allow us to take food directly into harder-to-reach areas that have a high concentration of need, such as senior mobile home communities.

When we met Heather, she was excited to show us the food that she had helped her mom pick out from our Mobile Market. “We got some strawberries, and bread, and some other good things.” Her favorite find? “Oh, strawberries! Strawberries are my life.”

The soon-to-be middle school student currently receives free breakfast and lunch at school through the free and reduced price meal program. When she is out of school, the produce and shelf-stable items they receive from our Mobile Market help Heather’s family save money on their grocery bill.

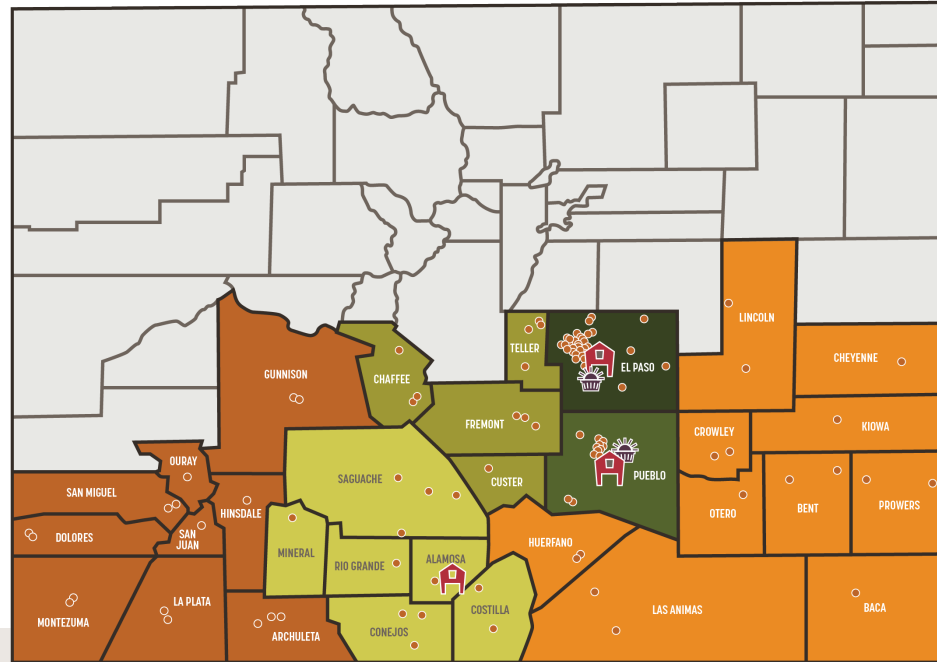
