Care and Share Food Bank has served the people of Southern Colorado for nearly 50 years. Over those years, and with your generous support, we have continued to expand, decrease food insecurity, and serve an increasing number of people in need.

It has been a hard year for families in Southern Colorado. Inflation increased by over 8% and the cost of food jumped 12% in the last year. We have witnessed a whole new group of people cross a threshold into need for the first time.

As a direct result of your generous support, we delivered over 20 million pounds of food to 291 partner agencies across our 31 counties last year. That is equivalent to more than 16 million meals distributed to people in need.

As we look to the future, we are excited to focus our effort on equitable food distribution across Southern Colorado. We need your help now more than ever, considering the increased need. We are on track to successfully serve a larger population this year and expect to deliver 17 million meals.

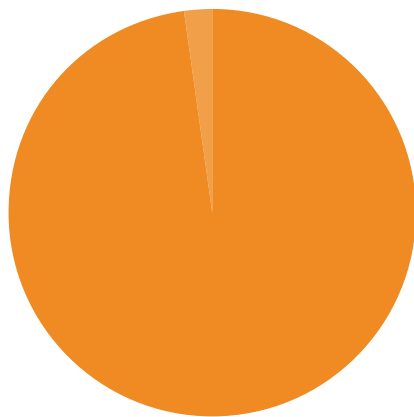

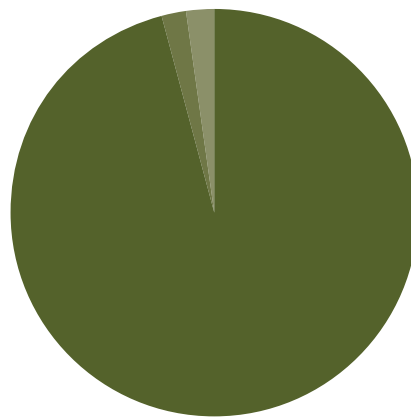

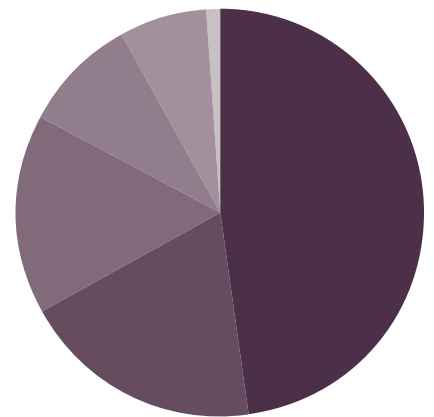
Revenue and Support

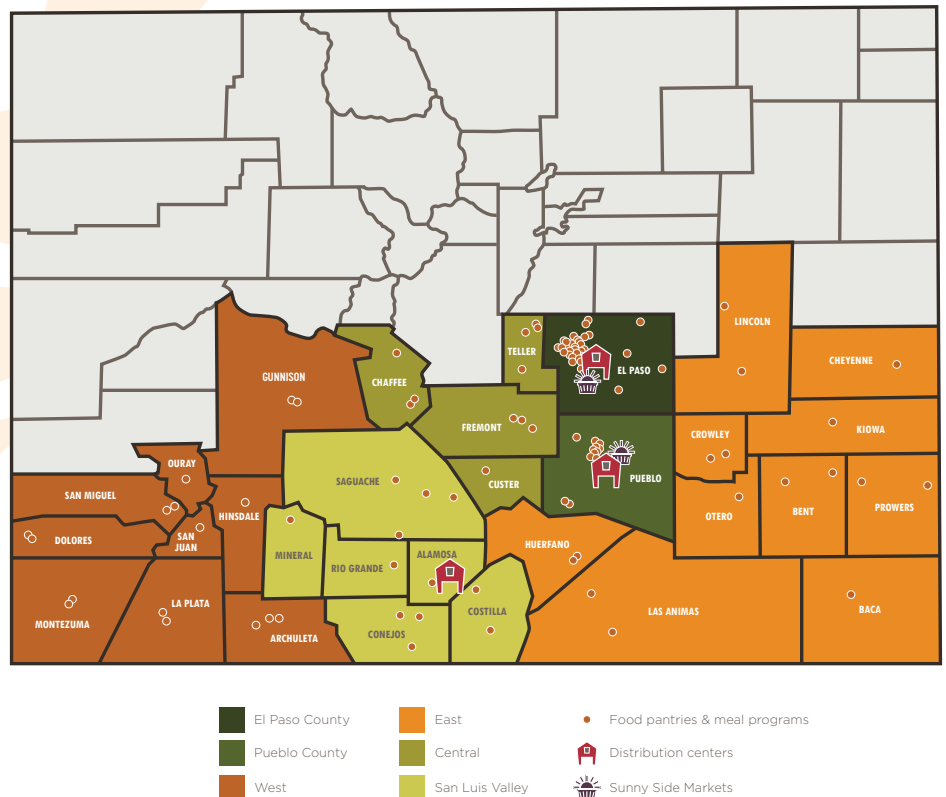
